Strengths of clients and self-determination

Strengths of clients and self-determination

A brief introduction

The international code of ethics (IFSW-IASSW, 2004) stipulates in its explanation of the value of human dignity and worth of the person that every social worker should respect and sustain the right for self-determination of every person (4.Principles 4.1.1). It furthermore states that social workers should stimulate their clients in making their own choices and taking their own decisions. In another topic it is mentioned that professionals need to discover and validate strengths of people and their environment (4. Principles 4.1.4). Nevertheless a restriction is mentioned in the text as well: social workers recognize the fact that clients are entitled to make decisions for themselves as far as these decisions don't cause harm to the rights and interests of others.

We would like to dialogue in this international university weeks about the definition and explanation of client self-determination. We will look further into the boundaries and difficulties this paradigm evokes for ourselves as social workers. Talking about self-determination brings us inevitably closer to strengths of clients and their networks. Does the strength-based social work enables us to work towards more self-determination? Does it recognize the difficulties of people and their environments?

Social workers, researchers, teachers and students from different fields will explain how they work with the self-determination and strengths of clients and their context. We will visit organisations working according to this paradigm or those who struggle with this dilemma. The aim is to discuss possibilities and restrictions of self-determination, strengths and the use of the informal network of clients.
