#### Who are we?

We are a functioning network of Social Work Faculties which was founded in 1998 during an international conference in Groningen (NL). In the meantime the network includes 16 partners in 13 different European countries.

#### What do we do?

We cover relevant aspects of social work in a multinational perspective through organising and participating in the International University Week which is held every year. We take turns - every other year we organise receiving students and teachers from the network - every other year we send students and teachers to other institutions in the network. The International University Week is often the first step for students to make personal contacts regarding exchange on an individual basis.

#### Our hosts this year

This year we welcome you at the St. Pölten University of Applied Sciences in Austria which was founded in 1996 and currently has appr. 1,400 enrolled students. Study opportunities comprise degree programmes and continuing education courses in the fields of Health & Social Sciences, Business and Technology.

The campus, situated in the city centre and covering an area of 14,300 m<sup>2</sup>, offers a new dimension of studying with superbly equipped laboratories, lecture halls, seminar rooms, a library and students' dining hall. The outside of the new building is dominated by glass and steel, the inside by wood and cheerful colours. A special highlight is the airy patio that permits studying under the open sky. The sunlit dining-hall, a terrace and numerous lounge areas serve as meeting points for students to socialise and relax.


